Working together for Kingston's allotments

Groveland Way to pursue voluntary management

At their recent AGM the Groveland Way Allotment Association (GWAA) voted to proceed towards V.M.

The GWAA was set up a couple of years ago at the 52 plot site in New Malden. Since its inauguration the site has improved tremendously. This is down to the hard work of their committee, including the Site Liaison Volunteer, monitoring the plots and ensuring vacancies are speedily dealt with. Hands-on management by people regularly on the site has once again proved to be the most effective way forward.

There is no doubt that the GWAA committee have shown they are more than capable of taking on the management role from Quadron Services; this will enable the site to reap the benefits of an income which can be spent on further improving the site.

KFAG hopes that with a reasonable lease offer from the Council the plotholders will support their committee to take on the full management role.

From the GWAA committee: "Groveland Way Allotments and the Association were spurred on by the efforts of Quadron in clearing a number of seriously overgrown plots in 2010. This initial effort enabled the newly formed Allotment Association to encourage first time allotment

holders onto the site. The newly found enthusiasm led Groveland Association itself to clear even more of the ground and get close to a fully let site.

The interesting combination of "veteran" allotmenteers meeting head to head with inexperienced but keen newcomers has been particularly beneficial. With a wealth of experience being handed down to those new to the site, and willing hands volunteering to clear up inherited rubbish, has meant that a really strong camaraderie has developed which has broadened into social functions where neighbours can meet and chat and exchange views and ideas.



In 2012 Groveland Way Allotments organised two BBQs, one in early summer and one for Bonfire Night and, in between time, a Tallest Sunflower and Biggest Pumpkin competition was held for our younger growers, but grown-ups were allowed to enter too! In 2011 and 2012 Groveland held two plant sales which helped populate the plots of new arrivals as well as old hands wishing to try something different.

There are a number of projects in the pipeline which could be selffinanced in the event that Groveland does eventually take up the challenge of Voluntary Management."
